It is intended that the corporation shall be entitled to exemption from federal in tax under Section 501(c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code and shall not be a private foundation under Section 509 (a) of the Internal Revenue Code Upon the liquidation or dissolution of the corporation, after payment of all of the liabilities of the corporation or due provision therefor, shall be distributed or transferred to another organization organized or operated for similar tax exempt purposes; all of the assets of the corporation shall be disposed of to one or more organizations exempt from federal income tax under section 501 (c) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code
